Theme: Preaching the Old Testament in a Christian church

Dennis Olson is the Charles Haley Professor of Old Testament Theology and Chair of the Biblical Studies department at Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, New Jersey where he has taught for the past 32 years. He earned a PhD in Hebrew Bible/Old Testament at Yale University and served a congregation as an ordained pastor for four years before coming to Princeton Seminary. His scholarly interests and writings focus on the Torah (Genesis-Deuteronomy), literary approaches to biblical interpretation, and theological and ethical interpretations of the Bible. He is the author of several books, including commentaries on the book of Numbers—Interpretation (Westminster John Knox 1996), Deuteronomy and the Death of Moses, A Theological Reading (Fortress 1994/Wipf & Stock 2005), and the book of Judges in The New Interpreter's Bible, Volume 2 (Abingdon 1998). He is currently writing a commentary on the book of Exodus.
